



TENURE-TRACK POSITION - ASSISTANT PROFESSOR

The Faculty of Education, University of Regina is inviting applications for a Full-time, Tenure-Track Position appointment beginning July 1, 2018.

The Faculty of Education seeks a scholar who can contribute to our Undergraduate Teacher Education Program in the area of Assessment and Evaluation (First Choice) or Curriculum Studies & Instruction (Second Choice). Preference will be given to those candidates who have experience working at the Elementary Level. However, applicants working in either of these areas at the Secondary Level will also be considered. The Faculty is a leader in Indigenization, has a strong orientation towards social and environmental justice issues in education, and is committed to enacting the themes, vision, values and mission of the University's Strategic Plan - *peyak aski kikawinaw*: Together We Are Stronger. Consistent with this orientation, the successful candidate will bring a critical lens to the construction and practice of assessment and evaluation or to curriculum studies & instruction. This approach will help to prepare pre-service teachers for the field as emerging professionals and reflective practitioners who are equipped to engage in fair and equitable pedagogical practices.

Duties:

The individual will be responsible for teaching primarily undergraduate classes in assessment and evaluation or curriculum studies & instruction, core studies, supervising undergraduate students in field experiences, and supervising graduate students. Teaching courses at the graduate level may also be a possibility. They will assume active involvement in collegial governance and Faculty endeavors and engage in individual and collaborative scholarly research.

Qualifications:

The successful individual will possess, or be near the completion of a Ph.D. degree with a focus in assessment and evaluation or curriculum studies & instruction at the Elementary Level and/or Secondary Level. The individual should demonstrate successful teaching experience in K-12 schools and university environments and have an active research agenda. Preference will be given to candidates who can perform their tasks competently in English and French.

Salary Range:

Depending on qualifications and experience, salary is normally in the Assistant Professor range (\$83,787 - \$106,571) as per the URFA Collective Agreement.
