TENURE-TRACK POSITION - ASSISTANT PROFESSOR OR ASSOCIATE PROFESSOR INDIGENOUS SCHOLAR in EDUCATION

The Faculty of Education, University of Regina is inviting applications for a Full-time, Tenure-Track Position appointment beginning September 1, 2018.

The Faculty of Education seeks an Indigenous scholar who can contribute to the Indigenization of our Faculty in one or more of the following five areas: Social Studies Education, Science Education, Educational Foundations, Language and Literacies Education, and Curriculum Studies. Applicants working in Elementary Education will be given preference. The Faculty has a strong orientation towards anti-oppressive education, and social and environmental justice. We are likewise committed to enacting the themes, vision, values and mission of the University's Strategic Plan – *peyak aski kikawinaw: Together We Are Stronger*. The Faculty has the largest number of Indigenous professors and Indigenous graduate students of any faculty on campus. The Faculty is committed to education that is inclusive of Indigenous ways of knowing which we support through additional teaching, scholarship, and community service resources. We believe the successful candidate will inspire and be a role model for future generations of Indigenous and non-Indigenous students alike.

Duties:

The individual will be responsible for teaching undergraduate and graduate classes in one or more of the following five areas: Social Studies Education, Science Education, Educational Foundations, Language and Literacies Education, and Curriculum Studies. They will supervise undergraduate students in field experiences, graduate students, assume active involvement in collegial governance and Faculty endeavors, and engage in individual and collaborative scholarly research.

Qualifications:

The ideal individual will possess, or be near the completion of, a Ph.D. We also encourage doctoral students to apply for the position. The individual should demonstrate successful teaching experience in K-12 schools, have an active research agenda, or demonstrate an ability to engage in high quality research. Teaching experience in a university setting and knowledge of an Indigenous language are assets.

Salary Range:

Depending on qualifications and experience, salary is normally in the Assistant Professor range (\$83,787 - \$106,571) and in the Associate Professor range (\$99,365 - \$126,941).
