This year, I chose to host a session about successfully addressing ethical issues when inviting marginalized populations to participate in research. The details of the session are as follows:

Title: Research Ethics When Including Marginalized Populations

Description: This session is designed for graduate students to address questions about how to develop a research protocol that will ensure the safety of K-12 students from marginalized backgrounds including Indigenous, immigrant, or refugee, LGBTQ, racial minorities, or language minorities. Graduate students will have an opportunity to interact with and ask questions of a panel of scholars who are currently working in these areas.
