We exemplify personalized learning principles (e.g., cooperation, creativity, innovation, social responsibility) in our work and in how we engage with others. The Branch's ongoing areas of responsibility include: Curriculum, Graduation Program Assessments, Foundation Skills Assessments, Classroom Assessment, and National/International Assessments.

Reporting to the Director, Provincial, National and International Assessment, the role of the French Curriculum and Assessment Coordinator is to develop and support new strategic directions for the design, development and implementation of K-12 provincial French Language Arts curriculum and assessment programs, based on a thorough knowledge of current pedagogy, emerging technologies, government strategic directions, as well as jurisdictional and academic research. You will also maintain the development and production of the current and future assessment and examination programs, consult and collaborate with educators in the system to develop, pilot, validate and implement curricular frameworks and programs.

Qualifications for this role include:

- Bachelor's degree in education or related field.
- Eligibility for certification through the Ministry of Education Teacher Regulation Branch is preferred
- Minimum of 3-years of recent experience teaching in French Language Arts programs in the K-12 education system or equivalent experience working with teachers and other educators.
- Experience with developing and/or implementing French Language Arts programs.
- Experience developing and/or implementing educational curriculum and assessments.
- Experience designing and implementing French Language Arts K-12 provincial curriculum standards and classroom assessment.
- Experience conducting research, analysing findings and presenting recommendations to stakeholders and senior management
- Experience selecting, managing and leading professional teams comprised of educational stakeholders.

Special Requirement:

This position requires the Coordinator to be fully bilingual (to read, write, speak, comprehend and otherwise interact in French and English) and to have an in-depth understanding of French education programs.
