

Tenure Track Posting – School of Education – St. Thomas University

The School of Education, St. Thomas University, invites applications for three (3) tenure-track appointments at the rank of Assistant Professor in the areas listed below, to begin July 1, 2019, pending budgetary approval.

St. Thomas University is an undergraduate, liberal arts institution with a fulltime enrolment of 1,900. Its students graduate with Bachelor of Arts, Applied Arts, Education, and Social Work degrees. The faculty members are distinguished teachers, researchers and scholars, and the university holds two Canada Research Chairs.

The School of Education seeks candidates willing to contribute to teaching, program development, and student advisement in the teacher education program as well as participation in University service activities. Each of the successful candidates will demonstrate excellence as a teacher and advisor and provide evidence of an active research program.

Note: Applicants must indicate the position(s) for which they would like to be considered in their cover letter.

For each position, applicants must have a strong commitment to practice-based, social justice-oriented teacher education and to building partnerships with public schools or community-based organizations. Preference will be given to certified teachers with a minimum of three years successful teaching experience at the elementary, middle and/or secondary school level, especially those who have experience with culturally and linguistically diverse student populations. A background in Indigenous scholarship and/or experience working in Indigenous communities will be considered definite assets. Teaching experience at the university level is also preferred. A Ph.D. in education or imminent completion thereof is required.

Completed applications must include a letter of application that describes the applicant's teaching experience, scholarly interests and achievements, and potential contributions to the program as specified in the qualifications listed above. The application must also include a curriculum vitae and a teaching dossier that provides evidence of teaching effectiveness, such as sample course syllabi, teaching evaluations, and a statement of teaching philosophy. Applicants should also submit samples of scholarly work related to their field(s) of expertise and arrange to have three letters of reference sent directly to Dr. Grant Williams, Director, School of Education, St. Thomas University, 51 Dineen Drive, Fredericton, NB, E3G 5B3.
