Indigenous Cultural Safety Training is delivered jointly by the BC Public Service Agency, Ministry partners and qualified vendor partners. Participation in Indigenous Cultural Safety training is encouraged for all employees within government and is designed to provide participants with what they and their ministries need to know to fulfill government's commitment to the Truth and Reconciliation Report (TRC) Calls to Action and the United Nations Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples (UNDRIP). Indigenous Cultural Safety training is comprised of pre-event work, face to face learning events, post-event learning, and access to online learning resources.

The Lead, Indigenous Cultural Safety Training is responsible for successfully managing the ongoing development and delivery of timely and effective cultural safety training for employees in response to the government's commitment to TRC 57, UNDRIP and related commitments under the Diversity and Inclusion initiative. The position leads the planning, implementation and evaluation of all aspects of the training and is highly autonomous, ensuring all components of training remain current, reflect wise practices, are responsive to learners, and meet corporate priorities.

The BC Public Service is committed to creating a diverse workplace to represent the population we serve and to better meet the needs of our citizens. Consider joining our team and being part of an innovative, inclusive and rewarding workplace.

Qualifications for this role include:

- Degree in Indigenous Studies, Education, Social Studies, Leadership, Business Administration or a related field. An equivalent combination of education and experience may be considered.
- Minimum 2 years of experience in leading and facilitating project teams and in working with multiple partners to deliver a product, program or service.
- Experience in planning, developing and implementing training and professional development initiatives as it relates to Indigenous learning. Preference may be given to applicants with a minimum of 1 year experience.
- Experience in Indigenous and/or western design, methodology, development and implementation of learning and development programs, curricula and products.
- Preference may be given to applicants who have experience implementing United Nations Declaration of the Rights of Indigenous Peoples (UNDRIP) and the Truth and Reconciliation Calls to Action.
- In accordance with Human Rights, only people of Indigenous heritage who meet the qualifications for the position will be considered.
