



The Department of Curriculum Studies, University of Saskatchewan invites applications for a tenure track position at the Assistant or Associate Professor level commencing July 1, 2019 with a focus on Educational Technology and Design (ETAD).

In addition to conducting research and contributing to collegial processes, the successful candidate is expected to teach in the areas of instructional design, multimedia design, educational technology, social media, and digital technologies in multiple learning environments at the undergraduate and graduate levels. At the Assistant level the candidate should have, or be near the completion of a doctoral degree in a related specialization, and possess the ability to work across disciplines. At the Associate level, applicants must have a completed doctoral degree in a related specialization, demonstrate the ability to work across disciplines, and have an established research program.

All applicants should demonstrate strong commitment to service through extracurricular involvement in community activities related to education, professional development and service, and/or post-secondary service involvement. Applicants must have relevant teaching and or instructional experience at the K-12 and/or post-secondary level. Preference may be given to those with a recognized teaching certificate. Applicants must demonstrate potential for scholarly productivity and the ability and expertise to supervise graduate students. Preferred candidates will have specific education and publications in one or more of the following areas: theory and applications of educational technology, digital and social media design and pedagogy, instructional design, learning design, and social science research methods.
