The bilingual **Manager, Teacher Certification Initiatives** is responsible for managing the Pan-Canadian Assessment Centre and Integration of Internationally Educated Teachers project, in coordination with the CMEC Registrars for Teacher Certification Canada (RTCC) and its two working groups. This role will appeal to individuals with strong project management skills, an interest in skilled professional mobility, and the teaching profession.

Reporting to the Canadian Information Centre for International Credentials (CICIC) coordinator and supported by an analyst, the manager leads all aspects of project implementation, including managing contractors, setting and tracking work plans and budgets, communicating with a broad range of stakeholders, and assuring high-quality project deliverables and outcomes. The incumbent will engage with governments' senior officials, professional regulatory bodies responsible for teacher certification in Canada, and external expert consultants.
