

## Tenure track position in Secondary English Language Arts Pedagogy

The candidate will have completed a doctoral degree in an appropriate specialization and possess the ability to work across disciplines. Candidates will have education and publications in theory and practice related to English Language Arts pedagogy, with preference given to specializations in literacy, including expertise in the writing process and/or drama in education. Applicants must be eligible for a Saskatchewan professional A teacher's certificate. Experience in Pre-K-12 and/or post-secondary settings is required, as well as knowledge of Saskatchewan English Language Arts Curriculum. All faculty will conduct research, scholarly and/or artistic work and contribute to collegial processes in the College of Education.
