Do you teach at a Canadian post-secondary institution?

Have you experienced **bullying, aggression, incivility, retaliation, sexual harassment and/or violence** in the classroom?

This survey is intended to gather information about the experiences of woman-identified faculty with contra-power harassment, and the impact it has/continues to have.

Contra-power harassment refers to incivility, hostility, bullying, aggression, retaliation, sexual harassment and/or violence that takes place when a perpetrator has less institutional power than the victim. For instance, between a student (perpetrator) and faculty member.

We also invite participants to consider and share their experiences related to this 'new normal' when answering the survey. The Covid-19 pandemic has highlighted the vulnerability of marginalized faculty, particularly when asked to shift teaching to online modes of delivery without adequate protection from online harassment (e.g. "zoom bombing").

The lack of available research on contra-power harassment at Canadian universities is significant, and your willingness to share your experiences will help fill this gap in knowledge.
