



Tenure-Track Assistant Professor Educational Leadership & Education Core Studies

The Faculty of Education at the University of Regina invites applications for an Assistant Professor in Educational Leadership & Education Core Studies for a full-time, tenure-track appointment with an anticipated start date of July 1, 2021.

The Faculty of Education seeks an individual who can contribute to the Educational Leadership (EDL) and Education Core Studies (ECS) subject areas. The Faculty has a strong orientation towards social justice in education and is committed to enacting the themes, vision, values and mission of the University's Strategic Plan. The focus of the Strategic Plan is on Indigenization and Sustainability. Consistent with this orientation, the ECS subject area engages pre-service teachers in critical practices around curriculum, pedagogy, and assessment in Pre-K-12 educational settings, while the EDL area focuses on graduate student understandings of the intersection of education leadership, policy, and politics, with an emphasis on critical and social justice imperatives. The Faculty offers a four-year B.Ed., a two-year after degree B.Ed. and graduate degrees at the Master's and Doctoral levels. Graduate programming in the EDL area is primarily delivered in an online format, through a blend of synchronous and asynchronous learning.

Duties: The individual will be responsible for teaching undergraduate classes in ECS as an integral part of the undergraduate program, teaching across Elementary and Secondary programs, teaching at the graduate level in the EDL area, supervising undergraduate students in field experiences, supervising graduate students, assuming active involvement in Faculty endeavours and engaging in individual and collaborative scholarly research. The successful candidate will also be required to engage in collegial governance by serving on faculty and university committees while making contributions to the wider community.

Qualifications: The successful individual will possess, or be near the completion of, a Ph.D. degree with a focus in Educational Leadership. The individual should demonstrate successful teaching experience in both K-12 schools and university environments and have an active research agenda. Teaching in online/blended environments is an asset. The individual should have (or be eligible for) a valid Professional A (Saskatchewan) teaching certificate. The successful candidate must be both a self-starter and capable of working collaboratively and professionally in the realms of teaching, student supervision (both in the field and the classroom), research, governance, and community engagement.

Salary Range: Depending on qualifications and experience, normally in the Assistant Professor range (\$89,914 - \$113,562) as per URFA Collective Agreement.
