GRADUATE CERTIFICATE IN EDUCATION

Is this for you?

This certificate is designed to enhance the work of educators in formal and informal settings: you might be a teacher, counselor, curriculum specialist, school leader, administrator, program developer, or you might be involved in community or organizational settings. You might be interested in continuing on to a Masters of Education (M.Ed.).

What can you expect?

You will get an overview of current educational challenges and models of leadership and curriculum design. The cohort model supports you to do hands-on work, experiment, and develop your practice as part of a diverse professional learning community. Join colleagues from across Quebec, Canada and internationally from a wide range of educational contexts including formal K-12 and college levels, as well as community, informal or non-traditional programmes.

PROGRAM DETAILS

- 15 credits, 5 required courses (36 hours per course)
- Length of time for completion: under 12 months with 3 consecutive semesters
- One course per semester in each of the fall, winter and spring semesters, concluding with two summer courses (Spring II)
- Cohort model of 10-20 students
- Online with hybrid option for two summer courses including the Bishop's Summer Institute (in-person, on-campus in the beautiful Eastern Townships of Quebec)

- Have completed a Bachelor of Education (B.Ed.) or relevant degree at a recognized university (normally with an equivalent minimum average of 75%). This could include social or environmental sciences, liberal arts or professional programs and more!
- Have at least two years of relevant experience (teaching or related professional experience).
- Required supporting documents including one letter of reference, proof of English proficiency, copy of the most recent university transcript, curriculum vitae, and a personal statement outlining your relevant experience and reasons for applying to this program.
