

**The School of Education
Temporary Full-time Appointments (2)
Curriculum, Teaching, and Learning**

Bishop's University sits on the unceded traditional territory of the Abenaki people, members of the Wabanaki Confederacy.

The School of Education of Bishop's University (Sherbrooke, Quebec) invites applications for two (2) full-time, ten-month temporary appointments in the area of Curriculum, Teaching, and Learning at the elementary and/or secondary level. The appointment will start July 1, 2022, or a mutually convenient time. The successful candidate will possess a Ph.D. or academic qualifications judged by the Appointments Committee to be acceptable in its place.

As Bishop's is primarily an undergraduate university dedicated to interdisciplinarity consistent with its liberal education mission, commitment to undergraduate teaching is highly valued. The teaching load is six courses, some of which may be outside one's area. The professor's teaching assignment will include courses that involve learning about teaching and learning, curriculum development, and the nature of professional practice, elements which are supportive of practicum experiences. Preference will be given to candidates who demonstrate the willingness to work collaboratively with colleagues, including the Director of Practice Teaching, to support students' practicum experiences. Knowledge of the Quebec Education Program or other competency-based curricula is a desired asset.

Some examples of courses that might be taught at *the kindergarten and elementary level* are: EDU 128 Orientation to Professional Practice (Elem); EDU 138 Foundations of the Teaching Profession; EDU 228 Practicum II – Elementary; EDU 238 Teaching and Learning at the Elementary Level: Practice and Reflection; EDU 309 Effective Teaching Methods (Elem); EDU 406 Student Centered Evaluation (Elem); and disciplinary Methods classes such as English language arts, social sciences, mathematics, and science and technology.

Some examples of courses that might be taught at the *secondary level* are: EDU 129 Orientation to Professional Practice (Sec); EDU 229 Practicum II – Secondary; EDU 239 Teaching and Learning at the Secondary Level: Practice and Reflection; EDU 339 Effective Teaching and Evaluation Methods I; EDU 410 Effective Teaching and Evaluation Methods II; a disciplinary Methods class.

Preference will be given to candidates whose research program takes into account teacher education, teacher learning, practitioner research, or other related fields. They will also be aware of the challenges of integrating the professional dimensions of our program with the tenets of the liberal education model.

The School of Education at Bishop's University approaches education as a force for social transformation, combatting intersectional discrimination and social inequality. We are committed to building greater social equity and responding to the Truth and Reconciliation Commission's Calls to Action and the Association of Canadian Deans of Education's Accord on Indigenous Education.

Bishop's University is committed to employment equity and encourages applications from historically underrepresented groups, including persons of all marginalized sexual orientations and genders, persons with disabilities, Indigenous Peoples and other racialized persons. There is the possibility of accommodation during the selection and pre-selection of candidates. Please note that all qualified candidates are encouraged to apply; however, applications from Canadians and permanent residents will be given priority.

The hiring committee recognizes that scholars have varying career paths and that career interruptions can be part of an academic record. Candidates are encouraged to provide any relevant information about their career experience and/or career interruptions.

Applicants should provide a letter of intent, current curriculum vitae, a teaching dossier outlining their teaching philosophy and evidence of teaching experiences, a statement of research agenda and research contributions, and the names of two or three referees who may be contacted.
