## 2-Year limited term lecturer position in social or ecological justice education

Applications are invited from qualified individuals for a full-time, limited term, lecturer position with the College of Education, Department of Educational Foundations, commencing on July 1, 2022 in Saskatoon, SK.

The successful candidate will hold a teaching-intensive position at the undergraduate level in the areas of **social and ecological justice**, in formal or community education settings and with a focus on land-based and place-based pedagogies. Candidates must be prepared to teach remotely, on campus, and in land-based contexts. The candidate will have completed a master's degree at minimum, with preference given to applicants who have completed a doctoral degree, in an appropriate specialization and possess the ability to work across disciplines. Preference will be given to candidates who have education and teaching experience relating to the theory and practice of **social** or ecological justice education, as well as community engagement experience.

USask and the College of Education are committed to employment equity and diversity, and Indigenous engagement is a strategic priority. **Applications from Indigenous persons are especially encouraged for this position.** The University of Saskatchewan relies on section 48 of *The Saskatchewan Human Rights Code* to give preference of employment for this position to Indigenous candidates. In Canada, Indigenous persons refers to those who identify themselves as First Nations, Métis, or Inuit.
