The Faculty of Education is located on the unceded ancestral territories of the Anishinabé-Algonquin people in the heart of the nation's capital. This recruitment also reflects the Faculty of Education's 2025 strategic plan, which focuses on innovation; educational technologies; a vibrant Francophonie; Indigenous rights; antiracism, equity, and social justice.

Title of the Position: Assistant Professor, Language Teaching in Plurilingual and Culturally Diverse Contexts

We are looking for a professor whose innovative research focuses on the field of language teaching with allophone and immigrant students in plurilingual and pluri-ethnic contexts. Ideally, the successful candidate will have a solid knowledge of Canadian Francophone minority contexts and will prepare and deliver courses focused on the teaching of French and English for future teachers working in French-language schools in Ontario.

Duties: The functions of a member of the academic staff include, in varying proportions: a) teaching activities; b) scholarly activities revealed by research, artistic or literary creation, or professional work; c) academic service activities, d) supervision of graduate students.

Terms: Tenure-track position (Assistant Professor)

Wage: Salary scale for an Assistant Professor starts at \$89,622 (as of May 1, 2023)

Benefits package: The University of Ottawa provides a complete benefits package, which includes long-term disability, basic group life insurance, supplementary health insurance, University of Ottawa Pension Plan and optional life insurance, as well as relocation expenses.

Skills requirements:

- **Education:** Doctorate in Education or equivalent in a field related to the position.
- **Work experience:** The successful candidate will have excellent research knowledge in a field related to the position, in addition to demonstrated undergraduate and graduate teaching skills in an interdisciplinary collaborative

environment. They will also need to be able to deliver hybrid and virtual courses. A passive knowledge of the other official language in Canada is a requirement for tenure. English-French bilingualism is an asset.

The anticipated start date is set for July 1st, 2023.

The application must include: an up-to-date curriculum vitae, an example of publication, the name and contact information of three individuals who can offer a reference to the applicant, as well as a transcript for each university diploma received. In addition, the application must include a letter describing the proposed research program and teaching interests of the candidate.

Application deadline: January 15, 2023. The consultation of applications will begin after January 15, 2023; however, we will continue to accept applications until the position is filled.
