

Limited Term Lecturer in Counselling Psychology

The Faculty of Education, Simon Fraser University, seeks applications for two full-time temporary (1 year, with possibility of extension) positions for Limited Term Lecturers in the Counselling Psychology program. Applicants who can contribute to the teaching of any of the core counselling courses, and offer clinical supervision are encouraged to apply. The final selection of candidates will be based on the best overall demonstration of potential for contribution to the program.

Qualifications

- Doctoral degree in Counselling Psychology or related field
- Registration with relevant professional body (BCACC, CCPA, or BC College of Psychologists)
- Minimum 5 years clinical practice experience
- Supervisory competencies (e.g. CCPA's Canadian Certified Counsellor-supervisor designation or Graduate level training in counsellor supervision) and experience conducting clinical supervision
- Ability to teach practice-oriented courses and provide clinic supervision

Responsibilities

- Teach counselling related courses and programming at both the undergraduate and graduate level, work with pre- practicum and practicum students.

- Capacity to practice and supervise from a multicultural social justice perspective
